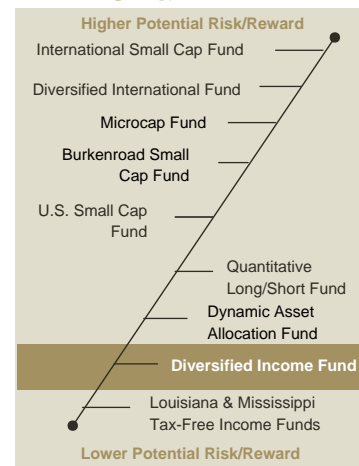

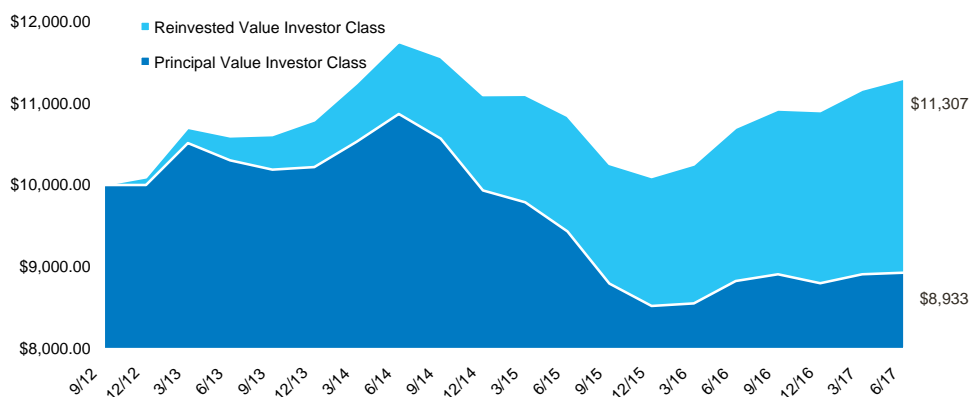
### FUND OBJECTIVE
